Our program at OSHC is a dynamic and ever changing one. The observation of your child and the identification of your child's needs (by our cohort of trained educators) assists in informing our program to best suit your child's requirements. This term we have had some wonderful activities inspired by the children. Some of these were:

Our OSHC 2017 survey came back with some interesting results. Some of the major points which presented themselves that we are amidst addressing are:

- A resounding preference for free-play amongst the children. This has already been addressed in the Term 4 Program and will continue to form part of our ongoing program. Allowing children choice is something that we have always aimed to achieve. Creating the parameters for children to learn, grow, be stimulated and be safe during free-play is the challenge that our educators are having to be creative with each week and will continue to do so into 2018.
- An overall concern from our community for the growing numbers at our service and the centre's ability to facilitate the demand for places. We are currently (and have been for some years) working closely with the school and other agencies to find a solution for this issue, whether that be a secondary space or increased classroom access. As we are all aware that the growing population of Epping is putting a huge amount of pressure on our service and our school. The best way forward short term (as well as long term) for our service is yet another challenge that we are tackling head-on. Please rest assured that we are doing our utmost to ensure we are able to continue to service our school's growing population with before & after school care. It is also pertinent to mention that we will inevitably be dealing with wait-
