- Cooking





ADMINISTRATION

Please note that ALL new enrolment at EHOSHC are required to sign up to our direct debit service for payments. We are moving towards all of our families paying via this method. If you are an existing family and paying via deposit on receipt of your invoice/statement, we would like you to consider switching to EziDebit by logging into our webserver. If you have any questions, please contact the centre.

OSHC admin would like to remind our Vacation Care only families to double check they are receiving their CCS entitlements. After an 8 week period of not attending a service, the registration elapses and you will not receive CCS. To check your status, follow the below instructions:

- Log in to MyGov.
- Select Centrelink.
- Click on the 3 bars (drop down menu) and expand Childcare Subsidy.
- Click on Enrolments.
- Check to see all children’s enrolment statuses are confirmed.
- If ‘pending’ and your child will be attending the service within 8 weeks – click accept in the action column.
